CECI Interregional Meeting



The city of Mechelen, Belgium hosted the 3rd Interregional Meeting on the 2-3rd of June, focusing on the action planning process. Following the different COVID-19 limitations that are currently still in place, the meeting was held virtually. Day 1 Thematic Workshop On Biowaste







Mechelen organized a thematic workshop about the valorization of biowaste. Eight speakers inspired the participants with good practices on involving citizens in the circular economy, e.g., growing mushrooms on coffee grit, biowaste collection in rural and urban areas, community composting, and other.

Aragon has been very active in involving local agents in the CECI project. The county of Jacetania introduced its experience in "Community composting and citizen training", showing what a sparsely populated region can do to promote composting among citizens.















Day 2 Interregional Meeting

CECI partners explained their currently drafted action plans, focusing on textiles, transport, and specific waste streams, such as biowaste.

Furthermore, CECI partners and their stakeholders wish to develop more sharing economy systems and hubs where innovative and inclusive entrepreneurship takes place.

CECI Good Practices



Mechelen Good Practices

Mechelen has supported the realisation of new circular initiatives, such as Circular Innovations Lab (CiLAB), which aims to test circular business models and creates jobs in the reproduction of clothing. CiLAB also wants to create awareness in the broader community and wants to develop innovative and high-value processes and solutions to close the loop for textiles. Another example is Coflab, a bio-incubator of coffee grit valorisation. Coffee grit and other organic waste is used as a nutrient for local food production. In the first stage, oyster mushrooms will be grown, followed by chicory and then sprouts. Coffee grit will be collected locally at restaurants, cafés and coffee bars, but also at the municipality. The harvest will be sold locally as well.

Sharing of Good Practices helps to distribute circular solutions and save resources across Europe. Through the knowledge transfer among the CECI partners, the regions will develop more relevant and efficient policies promoting citizen involvement in circular and sharing economy. Interregional learning in thematic workshops and studies, round-table policy discussions and site visits forms the basis for sharing expertise and, eventually, boosts citizen dialogue on the local/regional levels.

CECI Partners Policy Change



The city of Mechelen aspires to make an integrated action plan together with all of the stakeholders. Their aim is to become a circular city by 2050, and reduce the use of raw materials by 50% by 2030. This semester, the CECI local stakeholder group has been extended, adding new members from various interest groups. Mechelen plans to include circular thinking in consumption and value streams of food, textiles, furniture, and construction materials to become a climate-neutral city by 2030.

Information on the soft policy instruments, used by the city of Mechelen to foster circular economy practices, were presented to a wider audience in a partner event of the EU Green Week on the 25th of May 2021. Read more here.



CECI project partner, Marseille Provence Metropole, has developed several public policy tools related to the circular economy. In particular, the Ecological Transition Path program for SMEs, with technical and financial support, helps SMEs with their first steps, their development and the use of new economic models.

In April 2021, the www.reseau-preci.org tool was launched. It is used to share projects on the circular economy and develop projects between members. Everyone, including citizens, companies, etc. can share their initiatives and develop their working groups and communities. The action plan is in progress, the focus will potentially be on textiles, packaging or building insulation.



Business Agency Association in Varna, Bulgaria, has drafted up an action plan with a new vision for the City of Varna, focusing on the circular economy.

The focus is on how to implement a proper waste strategy in Varna, as well as focusing on financing actions related to circular economy projects implemented by citizens. Click and **read more.**















CECI Partners Policy Change



The Circular Economy Roadmap of Päijät-Häme, Finland, has been updated and given a new appearance. The next update will take place after the Circular Economy solutions for Citizens of Päijät-Häme – Action Plan is approved. The first draft of this plan was made with a working group and presented to regional stakeholders in January 2021. The draft was later enhanced with new information gathered from the Hackathon, which was arranged by LAB and the Regional Council of Päijät-Häme in April. Four groups developed four business models: 1) Clothing packages as a service 2) Grannies and kiddos transport service 3) Verstas; Sharing facility 4) Optimizing the use of empty space. The Regional Council received 35 applications for the ERDF 2014-2020 Sustainable growth and jobs, in March 2021. Five of these applications fitted the circular economy theme, and two of them matched the CECI theme. The CECI themed projects targeted sustainable solutions in assisted living buildings and digitalization and sustainability in fashion and textile businesses. Decisions about funding will be made in June 2021.

During the 4th semester, the Regional Council of Päijät-Häme has taken part in the drafting process of the next ERDF program period 2021-2027 on the national level. The new period should start in September 2021. The first call should take place at the end of the year.

Finally, the Regional Council funded a project, which meets CECI theme through AKKE funding (Supporting sustainable growth and vitality in the regions). The project **Tekstillit kiertoon Päijät-Hämeessä** (in Engl. Textiles in circulation) aims to prepare actions and pilot project to meet the upcoming separate collection of end-of-life textiles. **Read more here.**



MSIC CECI Partner from Ostrava selected topics for their action plan according to the policy instruments: Operational Programme Environment 2021 – 2027 and Just Transition Fund (JTF) Operational Program. Just transition fund (JTF) is one of the three funds available for regions in transition. Other strategic projects are, for example, CIRKARENA - National Competence Centre for Circular economy and POHO2030 (Postmining landscape 2030).

MSIC has a draft with the next steps that will be discussed on the stakeholder group on the 30th of June. Three main topics were chosen. The first one is focused on re-use and re-use centres. The second one is circular scans / climatic vouchers. The final one is a roadshow for municipalities. Two of these actions are currently in pilot phase. Read more here.

CECI Dissemination Events In Ostrava



In March 2021, MSIC (Moravian-Silesian Innovation Center) from Ostrava, the Czech Republic organized "How to compost in the city" online workshop for its citizens. It was organized in cooperation with the circular company called KOKOZA o.p.s., that promotes urban composting and gardening among citizens, companies and other organizations. Kokoza especially introduced practical tips for composting suitable for cities, either at home or in communities.

CECI project partner MSIC from the Czech Republic also organized recently two active webinars for the public. The aim of these webinars was to raise awareness and exchange knowledge leading towards a more sustainable lifestyle. The first about 'How to prevent waste from household?' and the second about 'Eco household cleaning'.

The workshops were hosted by the **Czech Zero Waste organization**, that informs, inspires, and advises citizens on living a zero waste lifestyle. CECI partner MSIC and lead partner co-wrote articles concerning sustainable practices of citizen involvement in **composting** and **living a zero waste lifestyle**.

Thematic Dissemination Event For Citizens In Varna

Business Agency Association (BAA) in Varna organized on the 8th of May 2021, a live thematical dissemination event for citizens in Varna – "From waste to resource, inspiring business ideas to motivate citizens".

The seminar was aimed at citizens, who want to be involved in the development of a waste strategy that focuses on a circular economy. Sustainable business owners also joined to share their activities and to present the already existing zero waste products and services.

Almost 30 people joined the seminar and took a part in a discussion focusing on how we can develop more sustainable start-ups in Varna. Part of the guests were representatives from Municipality in Varna and the Institute of Circular Economics, as well as Students from Sofia University, specializing in "Sustainable Behavior".

After presenting the good practices of the CECI project, our speaker guest from "Recycle Art Academy" showed how waste can be turned into art and even the youngest citizens can participate in it.

Before the end of the seminar, BAA presented the first start-up camp in Bulgaria for creating new sustainable businesses with a green horizon. GreenUp will provide the participants with theoretical and practical knowledge about the design, validation and growth of a sustainable business idea focusing on a zero-waste economy.




CiLAB upcycles textile waste

Marseille Provence Metropole contributed to the CECI thematic textile event facilitated by lead partner LAB. In the workshop, two stakeholders presented themselves and their projects in order to inspire others.

The first was Phenix Sport. It focuses on ethical and responsible clothing. Phenix plans to become the first 100% eco-responsible sports equipment manufacturer.

The second one was Awahi, an ethical brand that focuses on our well-being and that of the planet. Its philosophy is to reduce waste by recycling or reusing it, but also to limit the negative environmental and social impacts of the textile industry.

CECI organized an online thematic workshop on textiles with a wide range of experts and stakeholders on 30 March 2021. The workshop aimed to exchange knowledge and share concrete good practices from partner regions in Spain, Belgium, France, and Finland. 


CECI Events In Finland





CECI - Citizens sorting waste and contributing to circular economy. Lahti Green Capital 2021 is a pioneer in the circular economy, and this can also be seen in enthusiastic waste sorting in the everyday life of Lahti people. The citizens were already sorting waste in the 1990s.





Aragon has reported three new good practices, two of which have been transformed into videos. The first is "D'Hor el compostador, a school composting and environmental awareness" from Epila City Council. The second "Rezivilizate, UZ minimizes waste" is from the Green Office-University of Zaragoza. Furthermore, five of Aragon stakeholders have been included in the first catalog of good circular practices in economy published by the Ministry of Ecological Transition of Spain, proving relevance beyond the regional context.
