Burgas Municipality (BG) April 2021



- PAYT schemes are key to improve waste management. They are normally implemented with 'door-to-door collection' (DtD) and applied to tax residual fractions primarily to promote waste sorting and higher recycling rates, reduce residual waste and incentivise home composting. They determine the evolution of waste collection systems.
- Evidence shows that in coastal cities with significant tourist flows DtD can be integrated by the operationalisation of underground waste collection systems, shielded from vandalism and accessible by non-permanent residents via QR codes system enabling digital payments (...).


