

What is the Rural Pact?

The Rural Pact is a formal space and framework to boost

cooperation between national, regional and local governments, civil society organisations, businesses, academics and citizens to act towards the shared goals of the rural vision.

Introduction

With the adoption of the Communication on a Long-term Vision for the EU's rural areas, the European Commission committed to setting-up a Rural Pact. This Pact will contribute to reaching the shared goals of the Long-term Vision for the EU's rural areas but also fits into the EU's broader commitment of implementing the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals and ensuring balanced territoria development

Following the launch of the Rural Pact Community, in December 2021, over 1000 individuals and organisations have endorsed the shared goals of the rural vision and want to work towards their achievement. This draft is the next step in the Rural Pact process. Drafted by EU institutions and rural stakeholders1, it outlines the main features of the Rural Pact. Rural Pact Community members were invited to express their views on this proposal in May through a survey. Their feedback was taken on board for the final proposal which was presented at the Rural Pact conference on 15 and 16 June 2022.





The Rural Action Plan, which was adopted with the Long-term Vision for the EU's rural areas, represents the European Commission's commitment to acting for rural areas. One of its actions is to propose a Rural Pact, which aims to strengthen multi-level governance for the EU's rural areas. This means that the Pact will engage the European, national, regional and local level, all of which have a key role to play in the future of rural areas, to work together.


The activities of the Rural Pact could be classified as contributing to three broad objectives



Enhancing access to health services in rural areas – main conclusions



> The **curriculum** for healthcare studies should better consider the **context of rural areas**.



- Efforts are required to enable ongoing training and skill development for healthcare professionals in rural areas. These should focus not only on clinical skills but also on **alternative learning methods** and including **decentralised models of education** and **technological proficiency (digital divide)**

Training options in rural settings have demonstrated positive outcomes and should be replicated.

Innovative solutions in healthcare need to be integrated, aligning with professionals' workload, skills, and long-term viability.




Telemedicine solutions should be **collaboratively designed**, involving healthcare practitioners, patients, and IT developers.



Specific regulations and supportive conditions are necessary to facilitate telemedicine, mobile health units and community-based practices. These regulations should address legal barriers, privacy concerns, and healthcare standards compliance to ensure patient trust and effective implementation **(policy gaps)**



There is a need for **rural proofing** specific regulations and **unified political support and cooperation** across various public administration departments, including education, health, agriculture and rural development.
