#### CDR EUROPE overall objective



and innovative/high-techSMEs to become more digitally responsible.






#### **CDR EUROPE General approach**



#### **Semester 1 Core Phase**

#### Achievements :

- Creation of the Stakeholder ecosystem
- Capacity building sessions among staff/stakeholder/experts to introduce CDR concepts (1<sup>st</sup> interregional project meeting- Kick off Arezzo-IT-, stakeholder meetings)
- Individual SWOT for each territory
- CDR Europe interregional SWOT analysis
- Project visibility: 1<sup>st</sup> Podcast, Project Video semester1, social media, Project website, dissemination material (poster/roll up)
- 24 stakeholder meetings held; 190 stakeholders reached; 3 cross sectoral organisations reached; 4 events organised for a wider public



## Step 1: Consolidating concepts

**Semester 1** started to consolidate the concepts of CDR at interregional and regional level, thus starting straight away to **share knowledge and build capacity** among the public authorities in our consortium and their key **stakeholders**.

Lead Partner organized the 1<sup>st</sup> interregional meeting in Arezzo (IT) (03-04 May 2024) with participative sessions to learn about the various elements of CDR, starting with the CDR International Manifesto, providing a general overview of its main principles.




#### Step1: Consolidating concepts

Partners were also introduced to the **CDR Model** proposed by Professor **Michael Wade** in 2021.

Partners started to gather and share information on points of strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats of CDR aspects in their territories.

As result, a **SWOT analysis** for each territory and the CDR Europe interregional SWOT analysis were drafted.



#### **Semester 2 Core Phase**

#### **Achievements:**

Semester 2 **consolidated CDR concepts** at interregional and regional level, moving from general knowledge to a focus on **themes** and **enterprise type**. It launched work on **understanding challenges** and **seeking answers**.

- Challenge analysis at regional and interregional level (Stakeholder meetings, Seinajoki –FI- interregional Project meeting)
- Survey among SMEs in each territory
- CDR Europe Interregional SME Survey analysis
- Initial selection of GP in each territory
- 12 stakeholder meetings held; 173 stakeholders reached; 4 cross sectoral organisations reached; 7 events organised for a wider public





## Step 2: Understanding challenges

PP03 Regional Council of South Ostrobothnia hosted the 2° interregional meeting in Seinajoki (FI) (24-25 October 2024) where partners structured a possible framework and initial content for the SME survey.

The aim of the survey was to analyze the challenges of CDR adoption by SMEs in each territory.

The **SME survey** was launched through the EU survey platform in the second semester, with a total of 692 responses received through the EU survey platform.

Lead Partner drafted **an interregional overview of the results of this SME survey** analysis in each CDR EUROPE region.
