For example, the PI outlines plans to establish a monitoring platform to oversee the energy consumption of all public buildings, a point of interest for the project.







THEMES AND CONTENT related to the project topic.

During this second LSM we first presented our methodology approaches and examples and then we questionned the relevance of the different methodology approaches and indicators.

In our methodology, we count 4 approaches: 1) the global approach, 2) the collective buildings approach, 3) the economic approach (bills), 4) the instrumentation approach. The 2 first approaches were developed according to energy consumption allocation hypothesis (heating, hot water and electricity). All these methology approaches answer specifc issues to tackle real energy consumption. Therefore, it is interesting to question their complementarity, reliability, ability to be developed on an important amount of buildings and at last, their limits. For the moment, we mainly developed the first two approaches because they rely on open data. We are trying to develop the 3rd approach but it requires communication with co-owners to obtain the condominium documents. The 4th approach should be developed in 2025, during the instrumentation session.

Furthermore, we recap our indicators, how they have been built, their advantages and their limits. We also highlighted the gap between theoretical consumption and real consumption. These two issues gave rise to debate with all partners.

Last but not least, we talked about the importance to use appropriate communication when we will tackle these issues related to real energy consumption with the public opinion.

During this LSM, we highlighted the importance of sharing best practices between the different partners and the importance of study visits to discover and better understand local innovations in Europe. discussed the main assumptions of MonitorEE and BIOWIND and summarised the good practices presented by the Paris Climate Agency and those that had been developed in the country. During the meeting, as part of the MonitorEE project, the French partners presented the comprehensive activities they used to modernise a building from the 1960s: including: installation of monitoring of the heating system - Efficap, controlling the boiler, sunlight, the state of non-use of heating and insulation of the heating and hot water installation, modernization of the roof and installation of solar panels. In turn, when building a new housing estate, the investors in Paris levelled population density and installed geothermal

OBJECTIVES TACKLE AND BENEFIT GAINED DURING THE EVENT

We aimed at detailing the good practices presented by the Paris Climate Agency for the future development. We also aimed at disseminating information about the possibilities of CENWIS, part of the Kielce University of Technology, which is a R&D centre of the Uni by a lecture and study visit to its laboratories. It is a success because our stakeholders, most of which are companies, thought it was a crucial issue and exchange of experience (Paris good practices) was to the ponit and relevant in their daily work. Some stakeholders such as municipalities will now have an overview of the way of renovating bulidings to match the new Act on energy efficieny certificates.
