Peer learning in practice

- **♦ 78 peer reviews** implemented since 2019*
- 44 matchmaking sessions

1700+ organisations supported



Peer review: Sustainable governance



Peers from: Belgium, Spain, Sweden, and United Kingdom

Recommendations:

- better inter-departmental cooperation and participatory processes
- targeted communication: common narrative and storytelling
- developing a rolling action plan that combines short-term and long-term actions
- active involvement of the private sector and a formalised collaboration with the national level









Why Sustainability governance is a hot topic for local and regional authorities?

From global: <u>Transforming our World: the 2030 Agenda for</u> <u>Sustainable Development</u> (U.N. resolution adopted Sept 2015)

- 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) with 169 targets and over 230 indicators
- to be achieved globally by 2030

To local: cities, muncipalities, regions


- Cities are critical battlegrounds. They generate 70% of global emissions. They house half of humanity
- 60% of the SDGs are tackled at local levels
- Cities and other local authorities play a key role in addressing the policy challenges related to sustainable development



At midterm to 2030: most SDGs are not on track Progress assessment for the 17 Coals based on assessed targets 2023



Progress assessment for the 17 Goals based on assessed targets, 2023 or latest data



Better sustainability governance can help

Governance for sustainability: A governance system that enables us to meet our sustainability targets

"To achieve the transformation of our cities, we also need a **transformative management system**. We call this 'Sustainability governance'.

It takes the SDGs as the framework for our ambitions and proposes **a system of processes and relationships** that would help us build consensus, develop policies, and facilitate skills and enthusiasm to achieve our goals...."
