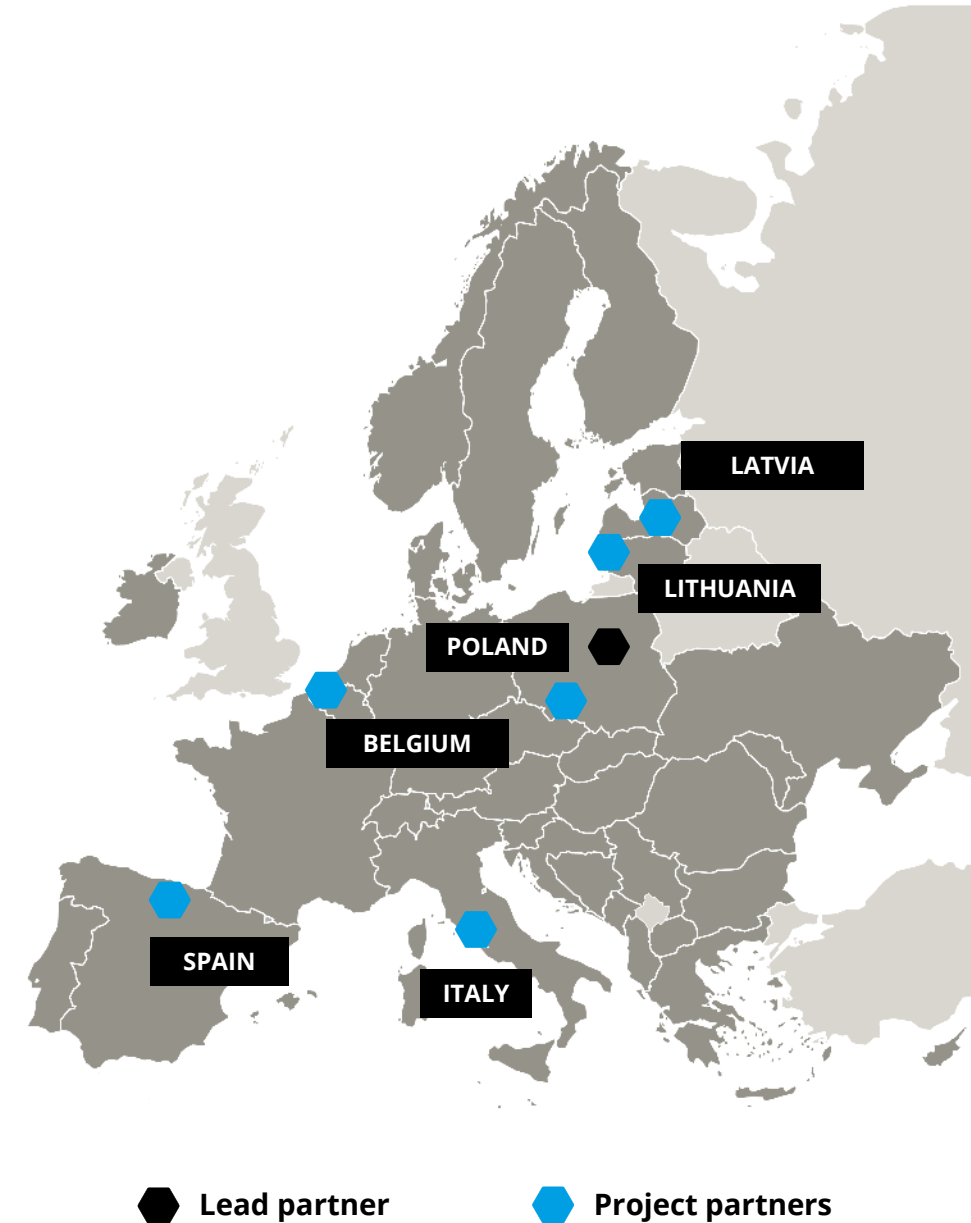

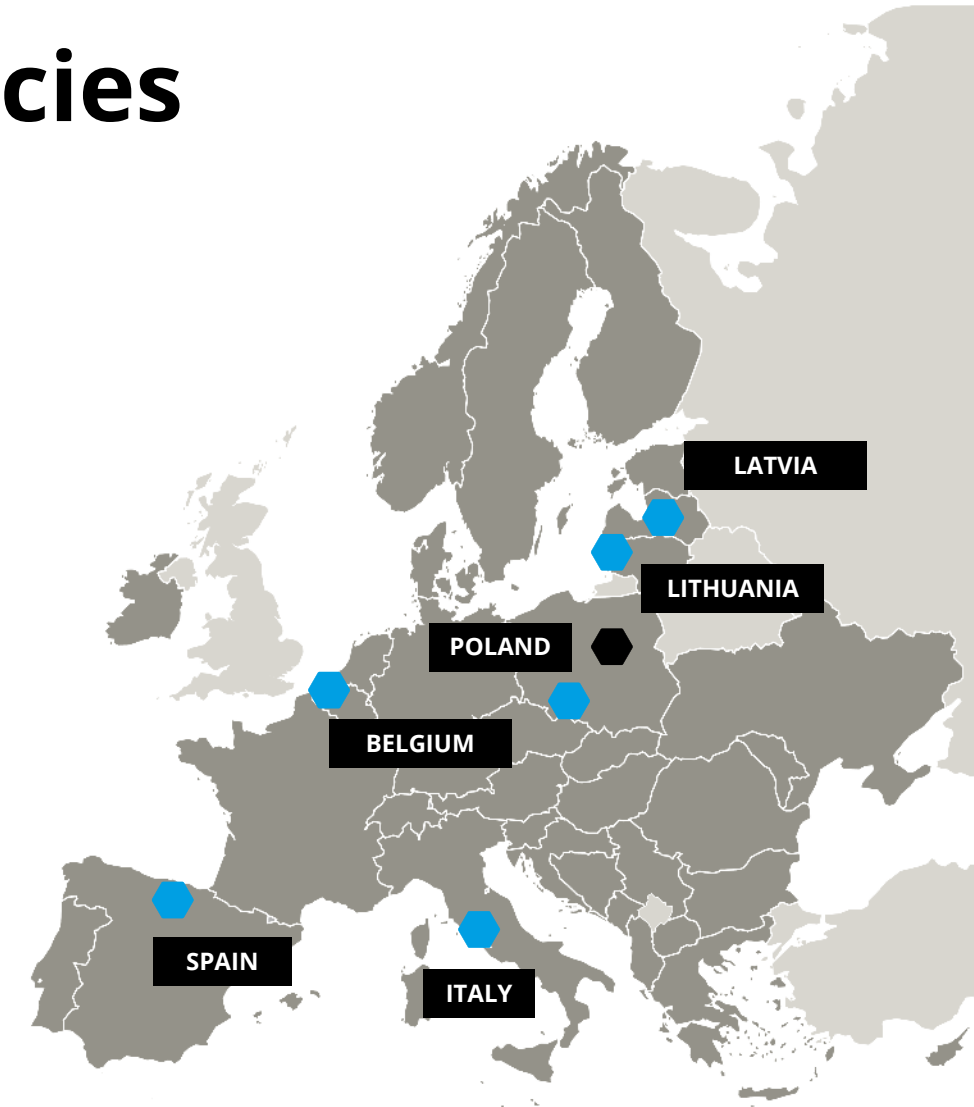

Expected policy improvement in **Poland**

Revitalisation programme of Nowy Dwór Mazowiecki 2016-2023

Expected policy improvement in **Italy**

Regional Law 7/2017 - Provisions for urban regeneration and building recovery



Regional Law can be improved by new projects to be implemented using lessons learned from InterRevita, adding specific provisions in order to enhance the response of small and medium cities to new challenges (change in the management), and also revision of the PI itself, according to the urban model of the intelligent, inclusive and sustainable city (Smart City, New European Bauhaus values).

Expected policy improvement in **Spain**

ROP ERDF Navarra 2021-2027



Through InterRevita, a new concept of urban revitalization will be implemented through the development of a new urban regeneration projects with a focus on the less-developed territory of south of Navarra, where technical, environmental and social aspects will be considered (e.g. Tudela city). The improvement of the policy instrument will aim the fighting against climate change and look for the integration of New European Bauhaus principals: sustainable, beautiful and together. Energy efficiency measures and implementation of renewable energy resources in social housing and public infrastructures will be implemented with a greater focus on social and economic aspects.

Expected policy improvement in **Belgium**

Realisation of climate adaptation, drought and rainwaterplan with a focus on circular water chains

There is a need to improve the PI through new projects, change in the management and revision of the document itself. Currently the plan consists out of some general recommendations which are hard to apply top-down.

Therefore, the City of Roeselare wants to do two things with the instrument. On the one side, we want to translate it and re-formulate it into concrete actions for the different neighbourhoods through a place-based approach. This means revision of the instrument itself and new projects financed by the instrument. On the other side, we would like to change the implementation / management of the policy instrument by involving the stakeholders on neighbourhood-level. To maximize the impact of the climate adaptation plan, it is important to bring people together (revitalization of the neighbourhood)

Strategic Development for Silute District 2015-2024
