SUB-MEASURE 6.1 Support for the installation of young farmers

Purpose:	The installation for the first time of young farmers as managers of an agricultural holding, to encourage young families to stay in the rural areas and help develop its competitiveness and the formation of professional partnerships
Timeframe	May 2016 - October 2018
Total allocation	578 mil. Euro (EAFRD)
Contracted value	558 mil. Euro
Beneficiaries	14.008 young farmers were funded, demonstrating the interest in this initiative;Of the total beneficiaries, 4.000 were women.
Benefits	This influx of young farmers helps stabilize rural populations and reinvigorate local economies, reducing the risk of these areas being abandoned.



What you can achieve with SM 6.1

- Refurbishment of farms (purchase of machinery/equipment/irrigation etc.);
- Conditioning/processing operations;
- Organic farming;
- Integration in an associative form;
- Development of a subsistence farm (by increasing SO);
- Complete takeover of farms with a low economic value;
- Planting native varieties/breeding native breeds;
- Increasing the level of qualification in the agricultural field;
- Adaptation of farms to quality standards and environmental protection.

Beneficiaries will receive:

- 75% of the amount of support upon signing the financing decision;
- 25% of the amount of support depending on the correct implementation of the BP.



The non-reimbursable support is granted for a maximum period of 3 years and is:

- **70,000 Euros** for farms that include conditioning-processing operations or ecological agriculture in the BP (for holdings between 30,000 50,000 SO);
- 60,000 Euros for farms that include in the BP conditioningprocessing operations or ecological agriculture (for holdings 12,000 - 29,999 SO);
- 50,000 Euros for holdings between 30,000 50,000 SO;
- 40,000 Euros for holdings between 12,000 29,999 SO.

Eligible beneficiaries

Young farmers, up to and including 40 years of age (up to and including one day before their 41st birthday) and with appropriate qualifications, who are setting up for the first time as sole heads of the agricultural holding

Multi-shareholder legal entities where a young farmer sets up and exercises effective longterm control over management decisions, benefits and financial risks related to the holding.

Transferability

Expanding the Good Practice to other countries offers an effective way to fight rural abandonment, stimulate the agricultural sector, and support environmental sustainability, while also addressing issues like youth unemployment and climate change adaptation. However, successful implementation requires careful adaptation to local contexts and challenges.

For easy implementation, countries would need a well-defined policy framework like Romania's, where clear eligibility criteria, timelines and financial supports are laid out.

Benefits:

Increased productivity per hectare; Competitive pricing for access to other markets (e.g. large retailers); Conversion to a commercial farm; Merger of holdings in order to increase the economic value; Increasing the competitiveness of the internal market within the single market; Improvement of management within the holding; Easy access to credits for further development;

Compliance with environmental protection, hygiene and animal welfare requirements
