1.Support collectives / BID

-Business Improvement Districts (BID): Area where the municipality taxes the businesses and passes the revenue directly to the specially formed BID-association

- **78 BID's** in Amsterdam



- € 4,8 million





1.Support collectives / BID

What are the benefits?

Stronger position towards municipality and other partners

 BID areas have become more attractive, visible, tidier and safer





1.Support BID/ Collectives





Funding:

Starting a collective (€ 5.000)



- Initiatives (€ 5.000)
- Branding (€ 10.000,- / 25% co-payment)
- Innovation (€ 20.000,- / 25% co-payment)



2. Intermediairs







-Initiator / Organizer/ Connector

Subsidy

Year 1 + 2:

- 75% subsidy municipality
- -25% contribution collective

From year 3:

- -50% subsidy municipality
- -50 % contribution collective









B. Example: Energy Poverty SME

Challenge: Helping entrepreneurs who have been hit hard by the high energy prices

- Energy advice: scan of the building, identify opportunities for sustainability and explain the energy contract
- Installing products (€ 800 available per entrepreneur)
- year of guidance to further improve sustainability











B. Example: Energy Poverty SME





- Due to the high degree of organization we reached more than 20 collectives (more than 1.100 entrepreneurs) in a short period of time
- ■84% Participation
- Entrepreneurs saved an average of 9% on gas and 9% on electricity, 688 tons of CO2



B. Example: Conversation with mayor






 Annual city discussion with the mayor, alderman and all collectives – new platform as experimental learning environment
